A VISION BECAME A REALITY

In 2003 Jean Solomon Darguin had his dream He started a school in Croix des fulfilled. Bouquets, Haiti. At that time, the school population of about 60 was in an unfinished two-story building. Solomon, a teacher, had worked at the airport to support his wife and two children. His family had moved to NY. After the devastating earthquake of 2010, Solomon asked his son to come back and help rebuild his country. Thus the Haitian American Caucus was established as a support to the school. While the torch for the school's vision of growth was passed to Samuel, Solomon remains a quiet, observant presence walking among the now 500 students. The original building has been completed, a two-story elementary building constructed, and presently a high school building is being completed. Zonta of Cape Giradeau, MO began working with HAC in 2012 and has since been a positive force at the school.

MEDICAL CLINIC

The Zonta Club of Cape Girardeau, MO took its fourth medical team to Haiti Oct. 10-15, 2017. The team saw a sharp contrast in the health of students in the school compared to those coming from the surrounding community. Doctors were pleased to see an increase in breast fed, thus healthier, babies. Many eye irritations are due to the bright sun and dust. Therefore, sunglasses were distributed to the older students and adults. Reading glasses were also available.

Thanks to the record keeping system that Dr. Cugini has developed, the following statistics were derived. 710 patients were seen in 3 days. According to her, we showed a "female gender centric", which is a Zonta focus. 333 of the HAC students were seen in the two days school was in session. The children are the most influential population for health care change in Haiti. Patients were referred at this clinic to the dental/medical team coming in March. Therefore, continuity of health care for the population the team serves is improving as well.

SCHOOL IMPROVEMENTS

It was an "awe filled" moment seeing the new high school building nearing completion. The older students expressed excitement in having their own campus area. Cubical cabinets were in some classrooms, helping with student organization.

A Vo-tech based team was present to do a study of the next level of training for students that are not college bound. Once a wall is built to secure the land behind the school, acquired earlier this year, this next project can commence with funding.

The yearbook that the 610 Project spearheaded had just arrived. A day to present them to each student family is being planned.

SET BACKS

Unfortunately, the Kids Against Hunger meals have run out. The container with more meals is being held in port, as more urgent supplies are being sent to hurricane ravished countries. This means feeding the children on supplies bought in country, which is a great expense. In addition, the government withdrew the book subsidy. This meant another \$9,000 plus cost for HAC. Thankfully, the funds for books needed the most were made possible by a generous donor.
