## **MEDICAL-DENTAL CLINIC**

Sept. 12-17, 2018 the Zonta Club of Cape Girardeau, MO took it's fifth medical team to the Institution Mixte Shalom des Freres school in Croix des bouquets, Haiti. On this trip two Zontians, Dr. Heather Cugini, clinic medical director, and Andrea Sachse, Zonta Haiti Chair and Sponsorship Coordinator co-lead the team of new members. Dr. Daniel Duroseau made it possible for the first fall combination clinic by doing extractions. He saw 39 patients in two and a half days doing 53 extractions. Assisting Dr. D were Nancy Winchester and Josh Greaser.



Dominique Dixon from New York worked with Drs. Heather and Greg Cugini in the medical clinic. Triage was conducted by nurses Jessica Rhodes and Kristen Steffens. The three day medical clinic treated 560 patients. and were able to dispense these during the clinic to families that had yet to return. These items will be an ongoing supply need, as many children walk a long distance on rocky roads quickly wearing out their shoes. A bus picks up students in one direction from the school when gas is available, and hopefully the acquisition of a second one will enable another route as well. Grades 7-10 are in the recently painted new high school building. The first graduating class will be in June 2020. Therefore, a business incubator and vo-tech program are in the planning. Many of the older students show talent in areas such as graphic design. The top floor of the high school will be a science/chemistry stem lab. Older students are now able to eat in the bottom floor cafeteria rather than in class-

rooms. After school snacks are now provided upon dismissal. The Haitian American Caucus, based in NY, continues to serve as an



umbrella over the school. Samuel Darquin, HAC Co-Founder and school CEO, said many children do not eat from lunch Friday until Monday.

# **SCHOOL NEWS**

School opened on Sept. 3 and the enrollment was at 305. Many students have not yet returned or may have moved. Each trip we learn something new. While the government requires black shoes be worn at school, they sell for as much as \$25US on the street. Families may hold their children out of school until shoes and a backpack can be gotten.

# **GROUP HOME**

Recently 75 students at the school were identified as restaveks, child servants. This means when not in school these children are house servants, sometimes with abuse. In hopes of helping older students in this situation a series of group homes are planned. The first will open in Oct. with a house supervisor and 12 students, some of which presently live at the school. These young adults will be learning life skills as they learn to run their household.

### **SPONSORSHIP & FUNDING**

The students and staff, HAC, and Cape Zonta want to thank all the sponsors that have supported students in the past and ask that you continue your sponsorship.
